It has been just over a month since the launch of the 1 WAGS Memorial Website – 1wags.org.au and I am very excited to share with you how well the website is being supported and viewed, not only in Australia but world-wide. The **Site Statistics** give an overview of the number of 'browsers' each day and which countries they come from. To date there have been 1,590+ Browsing Visitors from many countries – Australia, United States, France, Italy, Greece, United Kingdom, Virgin Islands -British, Netherlands, Turkey, New Zealand, Russian Federation, Germany, Sweden etc. There have also been 10,255+ **Spider Visitors** which are search engines and other automated programs, such as Google, that take information to be shared by other sites for research.

All of this in a little over a month!

There is a good coverage of browsers in all **MENU PAGES** from the website, particularly **The MEMORIAL ROLL, 1 WAGS HISTORY,** the **HOME PAGE, 1 WAGS COURSES** and **GALLERY.**

It is very pleasing for the 1 WAGS Research Team to know that our website is unique as it is the first to **List all Courses** and **Commemorate** those RAAF 1 WAGS trainees who served during WW2. It is a site to be viewed by grandchildren and great grandchildren and further generations of 1 Wag trainees for many many years to come.

#### **98 YO WWII BOMBER COMMAND VETERAN**

**BILL COOK** was a most interesting guest speaker at our March Social Luncheon Meeting. Bill was among the first group of RAAF ground crew members to head to England for WWII duties. Arriving in England in 1941 he first served with 456 (RAAF) Squadron, a night fighter squadron stationed at Valley, North Wales. After a time there he was posted to 460 (RAAF) Squadron stationed at Binbrook, Lincolnshire. Serving at 460 Squadron as an Electrical Fitter he serviced Lancaster Bombers including the famed 'G for George' which is now a very much viewed exhibit at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

Hearing Bill's story was made all the more interesting in that it was decided that we would do an *Interview type*

BASIC PROTECTIVE MEASURES AGAINST CORONAVIRUS

Regularly and thoroughly clean your hands with hand sanitiser or wash them with soap and water.
