POSTPONED BUS TRIP: The Committee has discussed our much delayed bus trip to the B24 Hangar at Werribee and the Werribee Mansion and Gardens and, considering that as we are now entering the colder months has determined that the locations for this trip, especially the Werribee Mansion and Gardens would best be left until Spring with a date to be looked at from late September onwards.

Another factor taken into account with that decision is the upcoming Dedication Ceremony relating to the No13 Radar Station "Cape Otway RAAF interpretive Exhibition" to which members of our Branch have been invited to attend on Saturday 19th June info re this follows below.

No 13 RADAR STATION CAPE OTWAY, RAAF RADAR INTERPRETATIVE EXHIBITION~DEDICATION CEREMONY A Dedication Ceremony for the 13RS Cape Otway RAAF Radar Interpretive Exhibition was delayed when it opened in June 2020 due to COVID 19 restrictions. We have now been advised that the Dedication Ceremony has been scheduled for Saturday 19 June 2021 at the Cape Otway Lightstation precinct. Although details are still being

finalised, the actual ceremony will occur around 12.30 pm. June is the month that No 13 Radar Station Cape Otway became operational in 1942, but the Dedication Ceremony 79 years later will be the first formal celebration of its existence. This wonderful walk and exhibition has been a collaborative effort between AFA Radar Branch President Chris Harneth and his team and the Cape Otway Lightstation......... yes, the lightstation is part of this exhibition.

The interactive entrance board at the start of the walk acknowledges, at the bottom of the board, contributions made by individuals that made the project possible, including "the generous donation by Marg Bennett in memory of her father Wing Commander James Eric REYNOLDS".



This Marg Bennett is of course our own member Margaret Bennett. Her father, Wing Commander Reynolds, following his war-time top secret Radar Unit responsibilities, became the post-war Commanding Officer at RAAF Ballarat with the establishment of the RAAF Air and Ground Radio School, which later, on 1 Dec 52, became the RAAF School of Radio. At the time her father was posted to Ballarat to be the Commanding officer and to establish the RAAF Air and Ground Radio School, Margaret was an 18 year old and lived with her family in what was then the Commanding Officer's married quarters and which is now the hut housing the Ballarat Morris Minor Club beside our Airport Hut 48 rooms.

Margaret tells me that during the five years of the war while the family lived in Essendon, they were never aware of where her father was going or what he was doing, so secret was the establishment of the various RAAF Radar units around our shores.



So there is a real connection between this Cape Otway exhibition and the former RAAF Ballarat. If you are in any way interested in RAAF history or Australian Military History, this is a "must go".

The "Lightstation Precinct" houses a collection of historic buildings, from the 1850's Keeper's Quarters and 1859 Telegraph Station to the No 13 Radar Station Doover established in 1942. It is actually a tourist trail that also references local indigenous highlights.

The lightstation is open to the public from 10 am to 5 pm, 7 days a week. Visitors can climb the lighthouse, explore the buildings and attend local presentations and history talks given by local guides.



The use of Corten Steel silhouettes to depict RAAF staff at work is an interesting concept.

There is also a cafe located in the 1858 Keeper's Quarters. Now this generally costs \$20 per person; however, with the massive input by the AFA Radar Branch, all Air Force Association members and family, on producing proof of Air Force Association membership, the price is reduced to just \$10 per person. For our visit to attend the Dedication Ceremony, *it is expected that there will be no charge*.

No 1 WAG William J. BLOMELEY was born at Moama NSW on 18 Jan 1920. He enlisted in the RAAF on 26 April 1941 at 21 years of age. At the time of his discharge on 26 September 1945 with the rank of Pilot Officer, he was serving with No 67 Squadron, a Maritime Patrol Squadron during WWII.
