The more than 4,000 people at the Dawn Service was dwarfed by the massive numbers lining Sturt Street for the march and the following 11am Service. The large number of families with their young children among the crowds lining the street was especially heart warming.

Unfortunately, the photo of us lined up ready to march turned out unusable.

After the Anzac March and Service, several of us headed down to the Cressy aerodrome where we witnessed some great activity with some up close and personal opportunities with the Tiger moth aircraft and with members of the public able to go for flights around the district.

It was a very well organised afternoon with Paul Lamont and his Cressy aerodrome team supported by members of the Wartime Living History Association and Geelong Military Re-enactment Group, who assisted in ferrying 'joy-flighters' to and from the Tiger Moth's in a WWI military jeep.

We will keep a lookout for future events at the Cressy aerodrome that members may like to visit. Paul certainly has some exciting plans for the further development of the site. We wish him well.

Arrangements for an annual **BATTLE FOR AUSTRALIA COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE** to be held in Ballarat have now been formalised with the '**Letter of Agreement**' having been signed off by both Ballarat Branch Air Force Association President Noel Hutchins and the City of Ballarat Events Manager Heidi Zukauskas. The Letter of Agreement states, inter alia, :

"As agreed, City of Ballarat will support the AFA Ballarat Branch in the financial and operational organisation of the Battle for Australia event, the Commemorative Service itself is organised and is run by the Air Force Association Ballarat Branch".

The agreement will be reviewed by both parties after three years. The Commemorative Service will be the major part of our annual Battle for Australia Weekend to be held on the last weekend of August with the Commemorative Service to be preceded by an Air Force Association formal Ball on the Saturday evening. For 2022 the weekend dates will be Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th August.
