TIME TO TAKE EVEN MORE CARE THAN EVER IN BALLARAT

Do you think that the requirement for members not to attend our openings if they have journeyed further than 30 km from Ballarat or have had a visit from anybody from Melbourne in the previous 14 days is a bit 'over the top'? Well consider this. On 30th July a 50 year old Portland man died from Covid-19. Portland is 350 km from Melbourne. A lady from Melbourne had a legitimate reason to travel from Melbourne to Portland to care for her elderly mother. Let us call the Melbourne lady Patient One. Patient One tested positive for Covid-19 on July 17. Two days later her mother tested positive...Patient Two. It appears that Patient one attended a commercial business in Portland, (believed to be a 'financial institution'), which resulted in a deep-clean of the businesss and also resulted in another person attending that commercial business being diagnosed positive Patient Three. Patient Three, who works part-time as a nurse and also in another job, was diagnosed positive on July 20 and it was her 50 year old husband who became Patient Four and who passed away on Thursday July 30.

The two children of Patient Three and the deceased Patient Four became **Patient Five** and **Patient Six.** The deceased man was associated with a business in Heywood where one of his work colleague became **Patient Seven.**

Patient Eight is an older relative of the deceased man. These numbers will continue to rise as further tracing is continuing. Are you **REALLY** taking this seriously? **If not, WAKE UP**. (NH, Pres)

1WAGS WEBSITE UPDATE:

The 1WAGS website (1wags.org.au) continues as a work in progress. Over the month of June the 1 WAGS Prisoner of War page was added in the MEMORIAL section. To date 139 1WAGS personnel have been found to have been held in captivity with 31 dying as POW's. These airmen were held in German, Italian and Japanese camps. 22 POW's died at the hands of the Japanese. The rest were prisoners of Italian/German captors.

The current FEATURE STORY on the HOME page honours the Centenary of The Arch of Victory Ballarat, **June 1920 to 2020**. Included in the story is information and iconic photos of the Arch, the Avenue of Honour, the Lucas Girls and the Official opening by HRH the Prince of Wales.
