THE CAMBRIAN HILL AVENUE OF HONOUR

Cambrian Hill is a small settlement just south of Sebastopol on the Sebastopol-Colac Road and just into the Golden Plains Shire district. It was in 1917 that an Avenue of Honour was established at Cambrian Hill. Forty trees were planted to commemorate local men who had enlisted to fight in World War 1. The Avenue was formally opened on 24th November 1917. In January 1919 an additional twenty trees were added making a total of sixty.

With this avenue being established on the Sebastopol-Colac road, destined to later become a major road, unfortunately, over the years, the trees suffered badly from road widening and the installation of major power lines on one side of the road.

In 1985 a new bridge was constructed at the Northern entrance to Cambrian Hill and the Shire Engineer at the time suggested that the Avenue of Honour should be relocated to another area.

It was in 1986 that ground was ploughed in a new location on Glassons Road Cambrian Hill and sixty blue-gum trees were planted for the re-establishment of the Avenue of Honour. A cairn was placed at the end of the avenue to honour all those who gave service from Cambrian Hill and District in all wars.

Unfortunately the blue-gums didn't do too well and in 2013, with assistance from the Buninyong RSL and a Commonwealth Government grant, the old trees were replaced by the planting of English Oak Trees.

In early 2020 with the avenue still not really completed, a group was formed with the task of seeking funding, researching and checking details of men and women from the district who had served in both WWI and WWII, and the placing of bronze plaques containing details about each enlisted person on plinths adjacent to the

memorial trees.

There are five plaques to RAAF members, four men and one woman:

The four men are:

149881 Atkinson, Kevin Robert,58003 Bandy, Norman Henry,143076 Pullen, Harold Leslie, and54385 Williams, John Lloyd.

The woman is named as:

Wills, Norma ~

Royal Australian Air Force for whom they have no other details. But clearly, Norma would have been a member of the Womens Auxiliary Australian Air Force, (WAAAF), not the RAAF. Research will be undertaken to see if we can find more information re Norma.
