Not only did Lachie get to see our Air Force Association rooms and view what we have done to honour and remember all those who trained at 1WAGS during World War Two,

Warrant Officer HOLMES completed 1WAGS Course No 43 after which he was posted to the United Kingdom for World War Two service with RAF Bomber Command. His further training would have included the lighter two engined bomber aircraft then moving up to four engined

Lancaster bomber and then becoming the Wireless Air Gunner in a Lancaster crew. His World War Two service included operations over Cologne, Germany. Lachie received a Certificate marking his visit. Thanks to Janet Bates for preparing the Certificate and meeting with Lachie and his family during my absence.

Following his World War Two top secret duties relating to the establishment of RAAF Radar Units around our shores, and prior to his post-war Commanding Officer post at Ballarat, Wing Commander Reynolds filled Command posts at both No 2 and No 3 Wireless Air Gunners Schools.

# BATTLE FOR AUSTRALIA DAY AND BATTLE OF BRITAIN DAY



**Battle for Australia Day** falls on the first Wednesday in September each year. **Battle of Britain Day** falls on 15th September each year.

Our branch of the Air Force Association will commemorate *Battle for Australia Day* while combining it with celebrating and commemorating the Centenary of the formation of the RAAF, *Air Force 100* as detailed on page 4. *Battle of Britain Day* will be acknowledged by Air Force Association Victoria State President, Squadron Leader (Ret) Max McGregor when he addresses the *Air Force 100* part of the Commemorative service at the Australian Ex-Prisoners' of War Memorial on Sunday 29th August 2021.

There is a very strong Ballarat connection with the *Air Force Centenary* with the WWII No 1 Wireless Air Gunners School established at Ballarat and the post-war Air and Ground Radio School/RAAF School of Radio. There was a RAAF presence in Ballarat until 1961 when the RAAF School of Radio was relocated to RAAF Base Laverton. There is also a very strong Ballarat connection to the *Battle for Australia* with many 1WAGS trained airmen losing their life in our war in the Pacific with some buried in foreign lands.
