

The Peter Armytage Story

Flight Lieutenant Peter Charles Tustin ARMYTAGE OAM

Flight Lieutenant Peter Armytage trained as a Wireless Operator at No.2 WAGS Parkes N.S.W and Gunner at Port Pirie South Australia. He became part of Bomber Command's 625 Squadron flying Lancaster aircraft in bombing raids over Germany.

On his last operation Peter's aircraft was shot down on the Dutch-German border. Peter was hidden by the Dutch underground but eventually became a POW. Repatriated back to Australia in 1945 Peter became a renowned horse racing identity.

He received an OAM for his service to horse racing and as an owner.

Additions to our database

We recently acquired the details of two STAFF members of No. 1 Wireless Air Gunners School 1940-45.

WAAAF Rita Annie Harris Service No. 104069 Flight Sergeant Ernest Leslie Albertson Service No. 36259

Rita Annie Harris was part of the Women's Auxiliary Airforce. She was posted to 1 WAGS on the 27 September 1942. She served as an Airforce Driver. Rita drove trucks as well as staff cars for Officers.





Fl/Sgt Ernest Albertson became an instructor and Wireless Operator on the 22 April 1941. He was posted to 1 WAGS Ballarat to teach Morse Code. Rita and Ernest met at 1 WAGS and married on the 16 December 1944. Ernie remained with the Airforce until he was discharged on the 22 January 1946 from the Air and Ground Radio School. Rita was discharged from the Airforce on compassionate grounds in December 1944, the year they married.



The Tom Roberts Library houses an eclectic selection of books and literature focusing on Ballarat, the airport, 1WAGS, wars, people and aeroplanes. Our librarian, Stephen Brown, brings you a short review of some of the many titles available to peruse.

Australia's Dambusters. The men & mission of 617 Squadron. Burgess, Colin (2003) Loftus, New South Wales; Australian Military History Publications



Tells the story of the Australian pilots and air crew who served in 617 Squadron, and the events of 16/17 May 1943, the dam buster raids.


The book includes a list of all aircrew who took part in the raid including RAAF crew members.

617 Squadron undertook 95 operations between May 1943 and April 1945 including attacks on Tirpitz, U-Boat pens at Hamburg, a list of which appear in a glossary at the back of the publications along with the Roll of Honour of Australian Air Crew.

Illustrated with numerous photographs of the airmen, their machines and war time operational photographs.

This book gives faces and voices to the Australian airmen who served in one of Britain's most famous squadrons and well worth a read by anyone interested in Australia's contribution to air operations in the European theatre 1939 - 45.

Darwin's Submarine 1-124: Lewis, Tom (2010) Kent Town South Australia: Avonmore Books



Details the first attacks on Australia by four Japanese submarines in 1942. Sunk with all hands, the submarine 1-124 remains outside Darwin today.

The book details the attacks by naval and air force assets to track, engage and then defeat the Japanese submarines outside Darwin Harbour.

For those readers interested in The Battle for Australia this makes for interesting reading as it details the defences of Darwin Harbour at a time when the town was under attack from the air by the Japanese air force

The book also details the lengthy attempt to salvage and later to commemorate the site as a war grave of the crew.
