# **APRIL 11**

The April social luncheon featured the story of another WWII Veteran.

Bruce Clifton enlisted in the RAAF in the middle of 1942 and trained as a pilot at No. 8 EFTS, Narrandera and then at No. 6 SFTS, Mallala.

Posted to England he was introduced to Wellingtons at No. 14 OTU, and after converting to Lancasters was posted to No. 57 Squadron RAF at East Kirkby.

He was shot down by Swedish flak whilst on an operation to Politz in February 1945. His story is about how he got out of the aircraft and was featured in the 1942 movie "One of Our Aircraft is Missing", which we screened at the lunch. The movie was nominated for 2 Oscars and features an almost unrecognisable young Googie Withers and Peter Ustinov amongst the cast of characters.

For the second part of the luncheon, Janet Bates made a short presentation on 1WAGS trainee Frederick Michael Spafford, who was one of the famous "Dam Busters" crew.

Spafford was posted to No. 50 SQN RAF in which he flew in Manchesters and Lancasters as a specialist bomb-aimer. He was awarded the DFM for his skill and praiseworthy example. After a tour of 30 Operations, Spafford joined the elite RAF SQN No. 617 for a special mission against dams in the Ruhr and Weser Valleys. He flew with Wing Commander Guy Gibson who regarded Spafford [Spam] as the best bomb-aimer there is. The operations were successful with Spafford being awarded the DFC and Gibson the Victoria Cross.
