#### 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF D DAY COMMEMORATION ~ 6TH JUNE 2019 At the Australian Ex-Prisoners of War Memorial, Ballarat

Our Branch of the Air Force Association was privileged to hold a service at the Australian Ex Prisoners of War Memorial at Ballarat to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of D Day, to remember all those who lost their lives on that day and to acknowledge the service of all Allied Servicemen and Servicewomen who contributed to the planning, preparation of, or who took an active part in, the D Day Operations Overlord and Neptune.

While low cloud stopped our planned flyover by Branch member Stephen Carter in his WWII Vintage Ryan aircraft, the misty rain did not have much affect on the Service on the ground other than maybe keeping at home some of our members carrying adverse effects of the winter weather as well as some of the general public who may have attended with better weather conditions.
